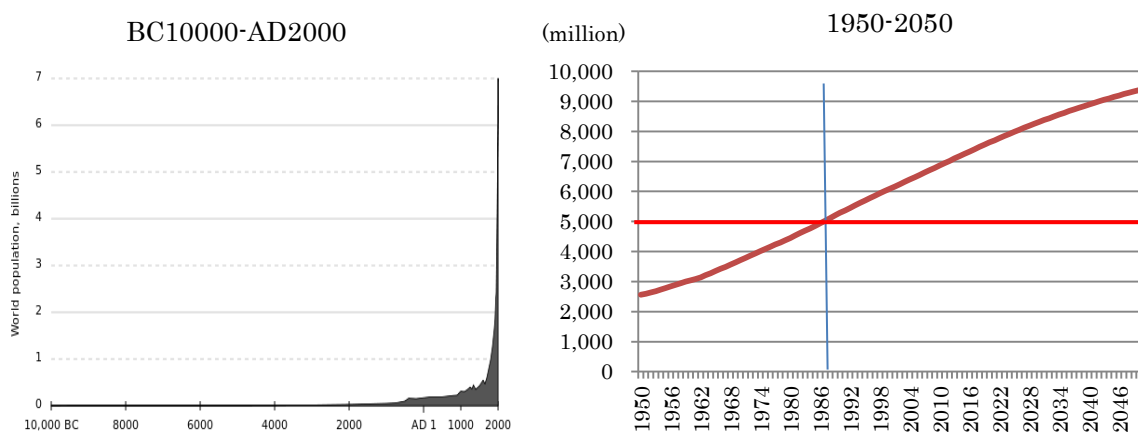

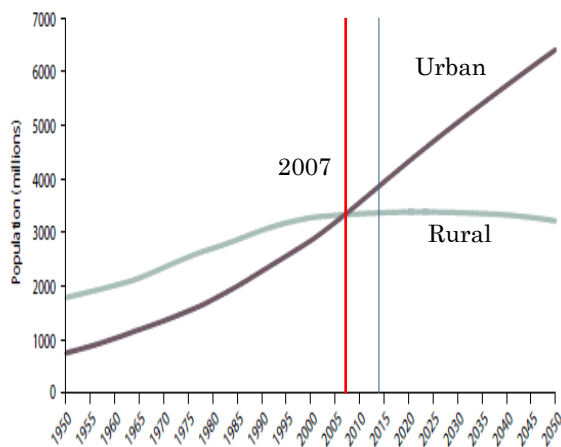


Left: Rapid growth has taken place since 18<sup>th</sup> century.

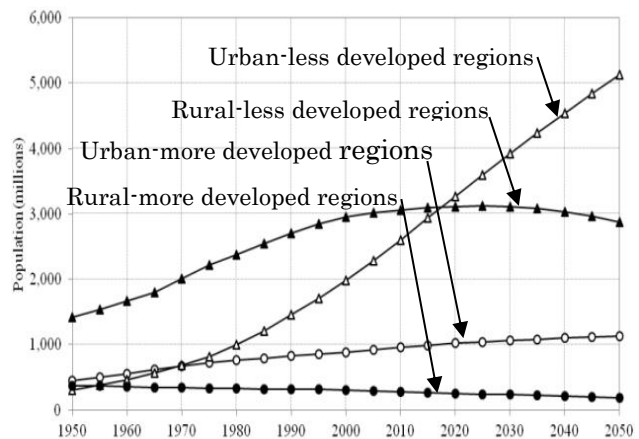
**Figure.1 World population growth**

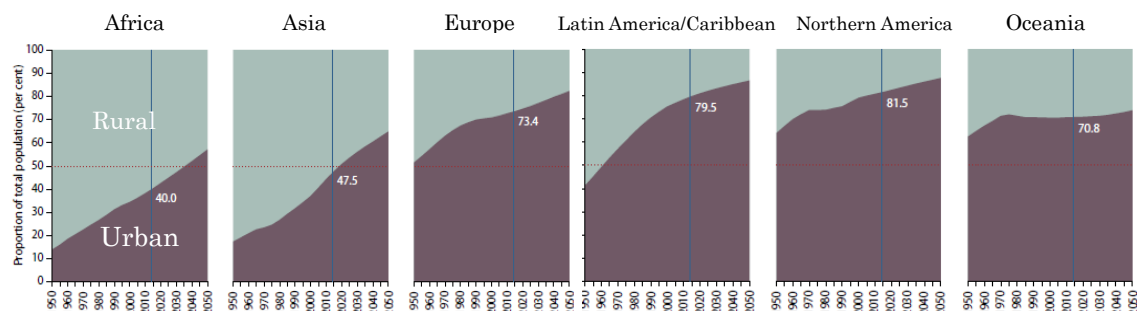
**Figure.2 Urban and rural population**
